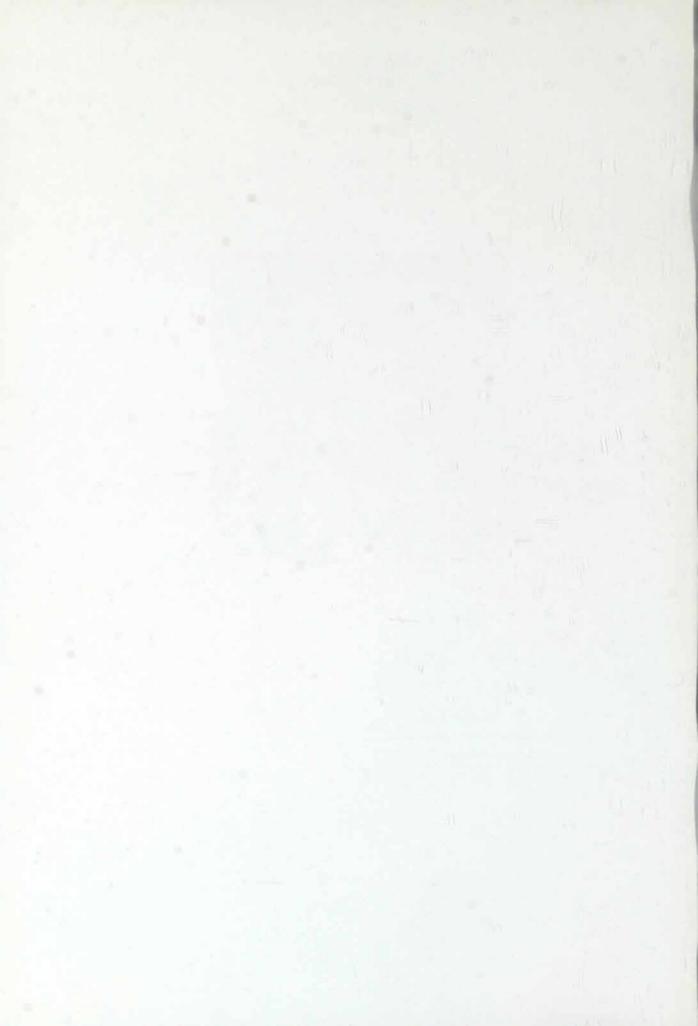

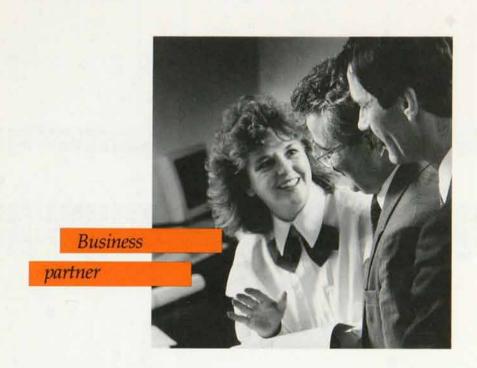

AUDITOR'S REPORT

I have examined the combined balance sheet of the Funds of the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec as at December 31, 1988, the combined statement of income, and the combined statement of changes in net assets for the year then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests and other procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

In my opinion, these combined financial statements present fairly the financial position of these Funds as at December 31, 1988 and the results of their transactions and changes in net assets for the year then ended, in accordance with the accounting policies disclosed in Note 2, applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

COMPLIANCE OF COMBINED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Section 47 of the Act respecting the Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec stipulates that for the purposes of the annual report of the Fund, all investments shall be entered at cost price or, in the case of bonds and immoveables, at the amortized cost price.

Investments recorded in the combined balance sheet notably include gains and losses in value resulting from interfund transactions made according to the market price on the transaction date, as mentioned in Note 2.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 1988

1 CONSTITUTION AND OPERATIONS

The Caisse de dépôt et placement du Québec is a corporation within the meaning of the Civil Code, created by a special act (R.S.Q., chapter C-2). It receives funds, the deposit of which is provided for under a particular act.

GENERAL FUND

The General Fund is a pooled fund for demand, term and participation deposits. The General Fund's net assets as at December 31 were shared among participation deposit holders as follows:

INDIVIDUAL FUNDS

The Individual Funds each have only one depositor who exclusively makes participation deposits therein. The various Individual Funds are:

Fund 301

For the Government and Public Employees Retirement Plan – unionized level – administered by the Commission administrative des régimes de retraite et d'assurances.

Fund 302

For the Government and Public Employees Retirement Plan - non-unionized level - administered by the Commission administrative des régimes de retraite et d'assurances.

Fund 303

For the individual plans, administered by the Commission administrative des régimes de retraite et d'assurances.

Fund 304

For the General Retirement Plan for Mayors and Councillors of Municipalities, administered by the Commission administrative des régimes de retraite et d'assurances.

Fund 311

For the Supplemental Pension Plan for Employees of the Québec Construction Industry - active participants - administered by the Commission de la construction du Québec.

Fund 312

For the Supplemental Pension Plan for Employees of the Québec Construction Industry – retired participants – administered by the Commission de la construction du Québec.

Fund 313

For the Supplemental Pension Plan for Employees of the Québec Construction Industry - additional contributions - administered by the Commission de la construction du Québec.

Fund 330

For the Commission de la santé et de la sécurité du travail.

SPECIFIC PORTFOLIOS

All Funds can subscribe participation units of specific portfolios which are pooled Funds grouping investments of the same category. As at December 31, 1987 and 1988, only one specific real estate investments portfolio was in operation. The net equity and net income of this portfolio as at December 31 were distributed as follows:

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The combined financial statements of the Caisse have been prepared by Management on the accrual basis and according to the accounting policies disclosed below. These statements include amounts based on best judgement and estimates.

COMBINED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The combined financial statements of the Caisse comprise the accounts of the General Fund and those of the Individual Funds. The summary financial statements pertaining to these Funds are provided as supplementary information. They also include the accounts of the specific real estate investments portfolio. The General Fund, the Individual Funds and the specific real estate investments portfolio are reflected in separate financial statements audited by the Auditor General of Québec.

INVESTMENTS

Investments in bonds, mortgages, real estate and short-term investments are carried at amortized cost. Shares, land and convertible securities are carried at cost. However, purchases and sales of investments between the Caisse's various Funds are made according to the market price. Investments held as at December 31 as a result of these interfund transactions are recorded in the combined balance sheet according to the market price on the transaction date.

RECORDING OF TRANSACTIONS

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded as at the settlement date, except for transactions involving shares and convertible securities which have been recorded as at the commitment date since October 1, 1988.

For 1988, the change in the recording of transactions involving shares and convertible securities does not have a material effect on the financial statements.

DIVIDEND INCOME

Dividend income is accounted for on the record date.

INTEREST ON SHORT-TERM INVESTMENTS - NET

This item includes interest earned on short-term investments and interest expenses on loans.

FIXED ASSETS

Material and equipment purchases are charged to administrative expenses, except those costs related to the purchase of telephone, computer and office automation equipment, which have been capitalized since January 1, 1984 and depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Set-up costs for the premises and other leasehold improvement costs are amortized over the lease term.

FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSLATION

Current assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into Canadian dollars at the exchange rate prevailing on the balance sheet date. Long-term investments are translated at the rates in effect on the date of each transaction or at the value determined by forward exchange contracts. Income is translated at the average rate prevailing each period.

Since January 1, 1988, foreign exchange gains and losses, which were previously reflected only under interest on short-term investments, have been allocated to interest income earned on bonds and to interest income earned on short-term investments.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

Administrative expenses are paid out of the General Fund and charged to the various Funds on a pro rata basis according to the market value of the weighted assets of each.

6 DEPOSITORS' HOLDINGS

Demand and term deposits constitute the Caisse's indebtedness towards the depositors and bear interest.

Participation deposits are expressed in units and each unit gives its holder a proportionate share in the net equity and net income of a particular Fund. At the end of the fiscal period of a Fund, the net income is distributed to participation deposit holders. At the beginning of the following period, this net income is paid out to the depositors' demand deposit accounts. The fiscal period of the General Fund, which was previously three months, was changed to one month as of January 1, 1988; as for the other Funds, their fiscal period remains three months.
